Adult illiteracy rates in Arkansas are startling, with nearly **400,000** adults struggling to read and write effectively. This issue affects individuals and ripples throughout communities, leading to economic and social challenges. Literacy councils across the state play a crucial role in alleviating this problem, and The Literacy Council of Union County is one of almost twenty such organizations operating throughout the state.

Literacy councils rely heavily on volunteers to carry out their mission with volunteers playing an essential role as tutors and mentors for adult learners. At the Literacy Council of Union County volunteers help individuals improve their reading, writing, and comprehension skills and use different approaches, including:

- One-on-one sessions tailored to students' individual learning styles.
- Group classes that provide a supportive environment that encourages peer learning.
- Online resources that utilize technology to reach more learners.

We provide training programs to equip volunteers with the tools they need, and we provide ongoing support to ensure that they feel confident in their roles.

Volunteers have a direct positive impact on literacy rates. Contributing to this cause is rewarding and fulfills a sense of social responsibility. Seeing firsthand the improvement in learners' lives can be deeply fulfilling.
